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English - Autobiographies and biographies. Using factual information from research to create autobiographies of a Tudor Monarch. Tudor Myths and Legends. Investigating Tudor myths to create our own Brayton Myth of old. Our British Author study will look at the works of William Shakespeare.

Geography- Investigating how our town looks different today to how it might have looked in Tudor times as well as exploring the features of our town and identifying those that would and would not have been present in Tudor times.

History - Who were the Tudors and when did they live and what did people wear in Tudor times? Exploring why some of our favourite foods would not have been available in Tudor times and investigating common crimes and their punishments thinking about how fair Tudor punishments were compared to the crime.

Art - Exploring why the Tudors had portraits painted and discovering the work of Hans Holbein. Discovering what coats of arms are and how they are used as well as investigating the Tudor coat of arms and exploring what symbols and colours mean. Finding out what the Tudor rose is and what it represents including creating a Tudor rose out of clay.

Computing-Thinking about why it is important to check information for accuracy and why information may not be accurate by checking facts about the Tudors for accuracy online. Planning and creating a Tudors display using computers.

Music -Singing familiar rounds relating to the Tudors exploring what rounds are and how they work as well as practising singing familiar rounds and changing the words of familiar rounds to relate to the Tudors

Design & Technology- Designing, making and evaluating Ann Bolen's execution sword exploring the style and structure of traditional weaponry and thinking of different ways to creating our own replicas.
