This Week

EYFS children listened to the story of the 'Leaf Man' and then gathered leaves and made their own Leaf Man. They used him to create some fabulous stories. Autumn is such a fabulous season!

Year 1 children are trying really hard to listen carefully and stay quiet – ask them about the new 'Give me 5' routine! They've written speech for the 'Owl Babies' and practised CAPITAL LETTERS. In PE they have been quietly practising ball skills.

Year 2 children have been learning 10 more and less than a two digit number. In English they have been writing Great Fire of London poems. They have also been designing and making Tudor houses.

Year 3 children created artwork using papier mache. Adjectives and adverbs were the focus of their story writing this week. Challenge them to see if they can remember which is which! Their dance lesson was fantastic as they produced thoughtful sequences of volcanic eruption!

Wow!
What a busy 'Brayton children are authors of the future' kind of week!

Year 4 have produced a range of interesting and exciting Anglo-Saxon hero stories. Building on from last week, they created tension extremely well by varying sentence length and choosing effective language including powerful verbs and adverbs.

Year 6 children have made 'mocktails' fit for royalty on the Titanic. They combined maths, art DT and English skills in order to design, make and advertise them. They have also looked at multiplication in maths and personification in English.

Year 5 children have been finding out why we have day and night and have learned about the apparent movement of the sun across the sky. JK Rowling had better watch out – Asteroid children are after her job! They have been writing a narrative based on 'The Way Back Home.' In maths, Pluto have been solving addition problems.

- Income Support or income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of £16,190 or less
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' - the payment you may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - In England, if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).
